From the President's Corner

I am happy to report that the Kopachka Folk Dancer's transition to our new venue, the Strawberry Recreation Center in Mill Valley, has been a great success. For those who have yet to join us this fall, please do! You will be impressed with the spaciousness and the fantastic floor for dancing. We thank the staff of the Recreation Center for looking after us in our location.

So far we have had two successful events this fall. Most recently, we had the pleasure of dancing to Bulgarika at our fall 'Hardly Strictly Balkan' livemusic party. Bulgarika is composed of four master musicians from Bulgaria: Nikolay Kolev on gadulka; Donka Koleva, vocal; Vassil Bebelekov on gajda; and Dragni Dragnev on tâpan, gaida, and keyboard. Nikolay and Donka now live in Queens, and Vassil lives in San Jose; Dragni came from Varna just for this tour.

The turn out was great: 76 dancers, many from our fellow groups in the North Bay. Everyone enjoyed the musicianship and spirit of Bulgarika, and the band enjoyed playing for us.

The week before our party we were treated to a master dance lesson from Greekinternational expert on Macedonian folk dance, Yannis Konstantinou. Yannis shared his enthusiasm and deep knowledge of the dances, and the cultural context of the dances, from the Macedonian and Thracian regions of Greece. I was lucky to have taken a workshop in 1986 from Yannis' father, Simos Konstantinou, who was a well-known dancer and teacher himself.

Thanks to Joyce Clyde and Caroline Simmonds, for arranging the visits of Bulgarika and Yannis, respectively, and everyone else who pitched in to make the events so successful.

The next big event on the dance horizon is the 63rd annual Kolo Festival, November 28th and 29th, at the Croatian American Cultural Center in San Francisco, featuring teaching by Steve Kotansky (Macedonian and Albanian) and Ahmet Lüleci (Turkish), two of the best teachers
